- Any timing related variances from actual weeks have not been re-timed into future periods for purposes of this analysis

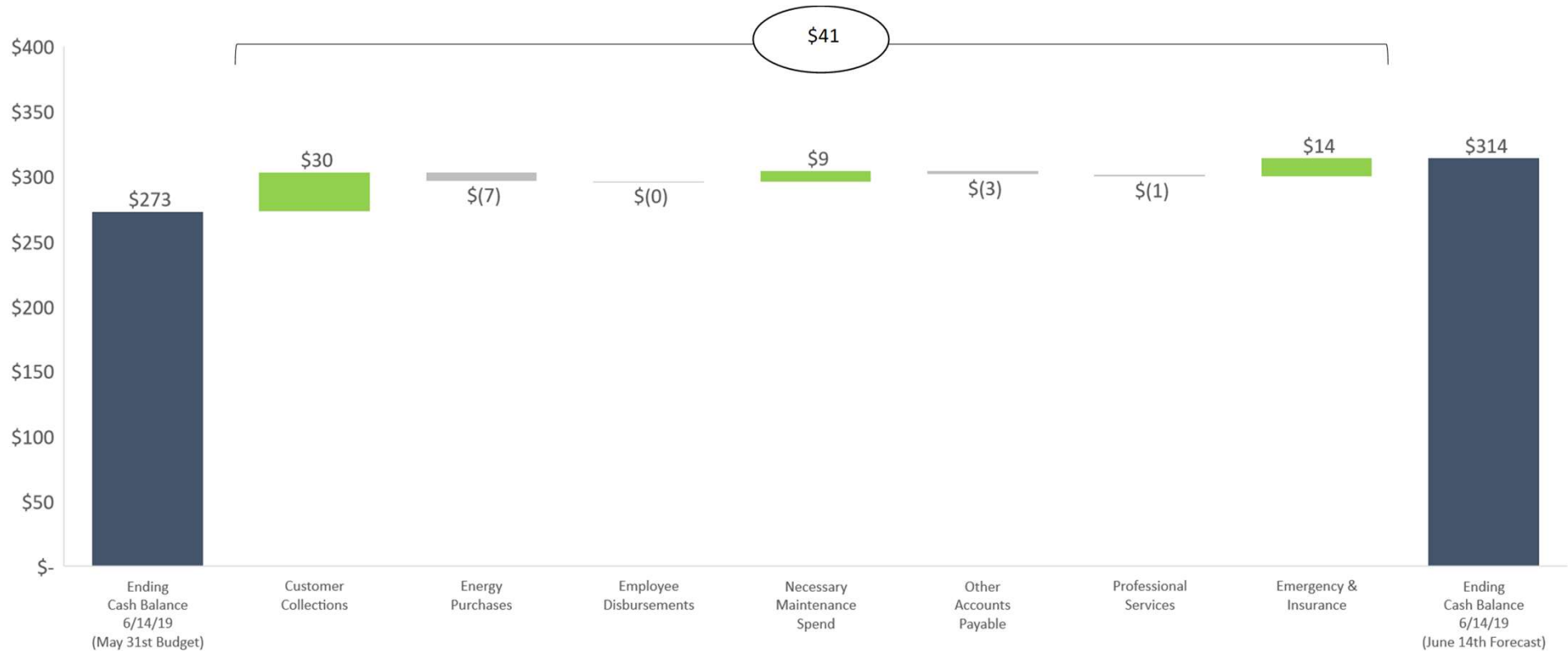
