To: MANAGED CARE ORGANIZATIONS (MCOS) CONTRACTED TO OFFER SERVICES UNDER THE GOVERNMENT HEALTH PLAN PROGRAM (THE "VITAL" PROGRAM)

Re: HEDIS MY 2022 for Report 24 and Adult and Child Core Measures for Report 26

The Puerto Rico Health Insurance Administration announces the revised HEDIS measures list for the 2022 period. The MCO must use the HEDIS MY 2022 Volume 2: Technical Specifications for Health Plans. Please be advised that the measurement period is January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022 for HEDIS MY 2022. The MCO must use hybrid data for the Comprehensive Diabetes Care, Prenatal and Postpartum Care and Controlling High Blood Pressure measures, and administrative data for the rest of the measures.

The Contractor will submit the following standardized HEDIS measures for the HEDIS MY 2022 for Report 24: Audited HEDIS Results Report and Report 26, Adult and Child Core Measures:


