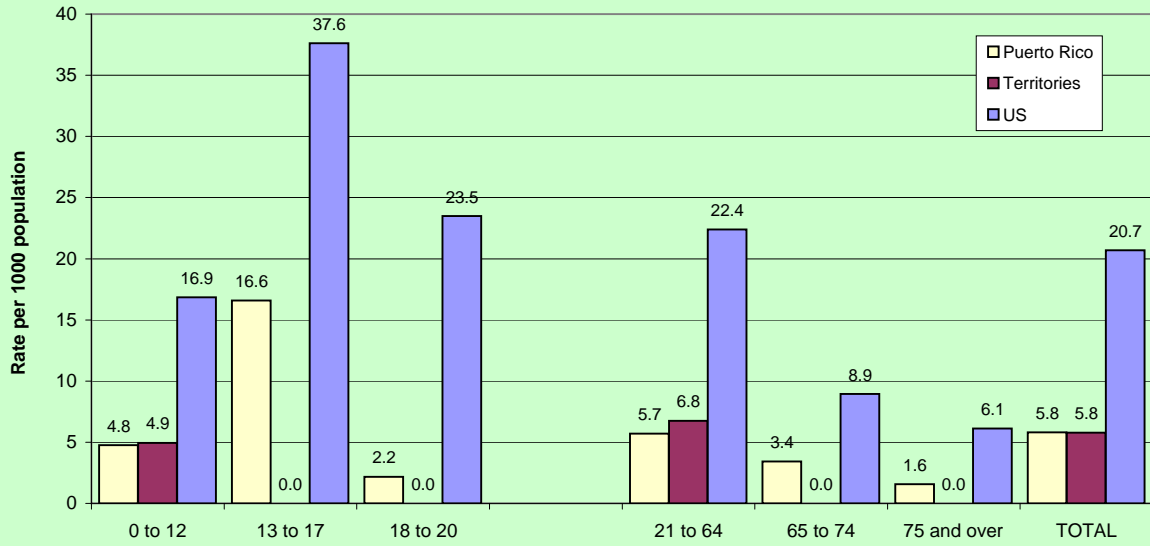

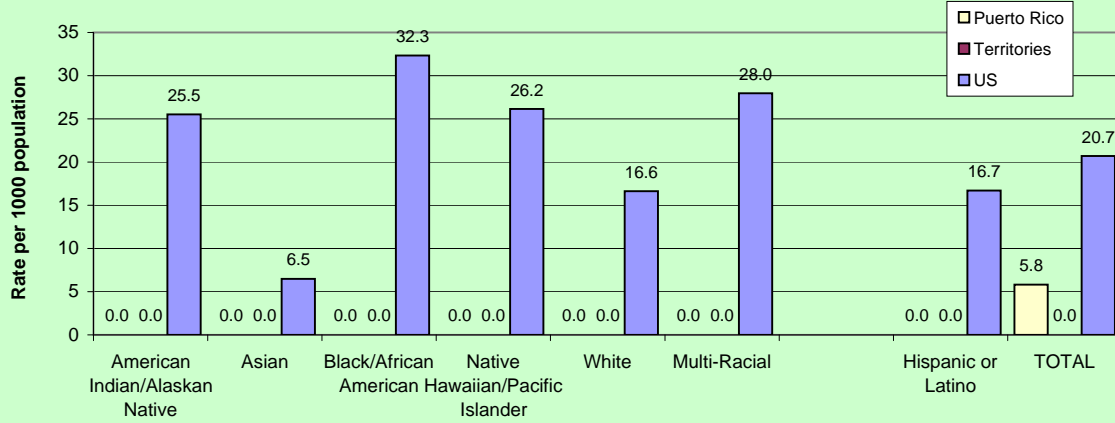

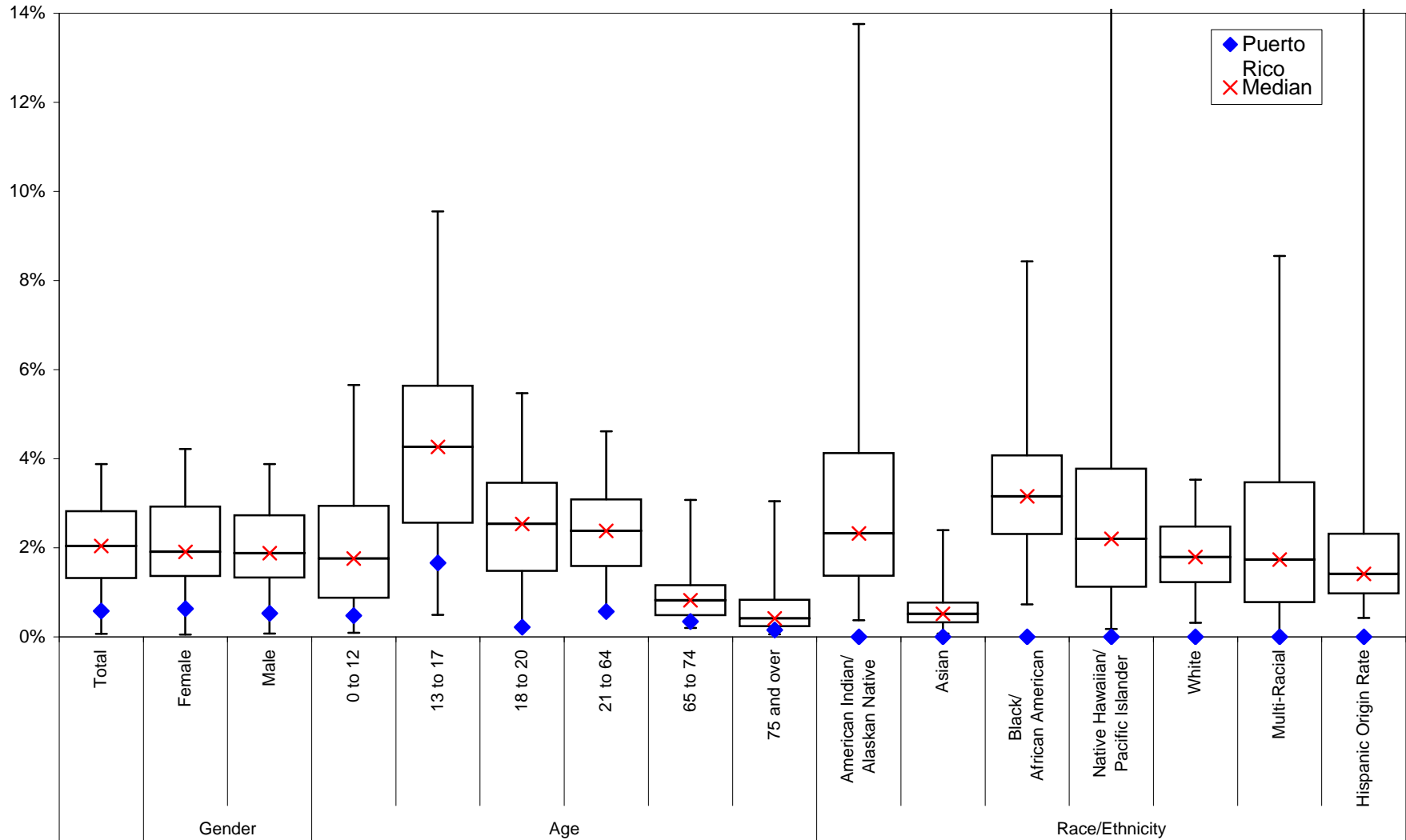
**Rate of Mental Health Service Utilization By Age (data from Access Domain: Table1): URS Year 7: Rate per 1000 population**

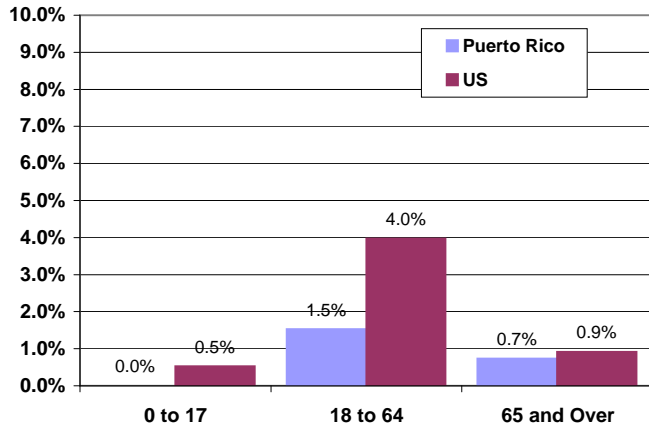

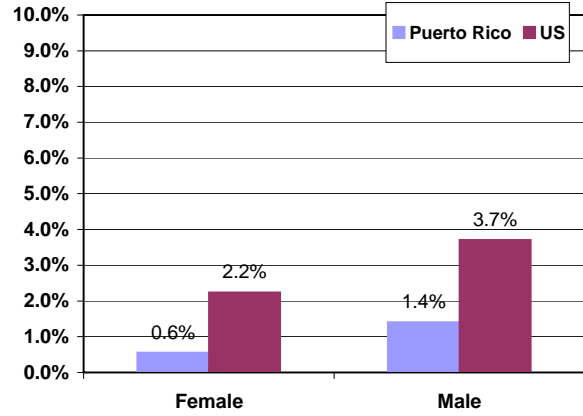

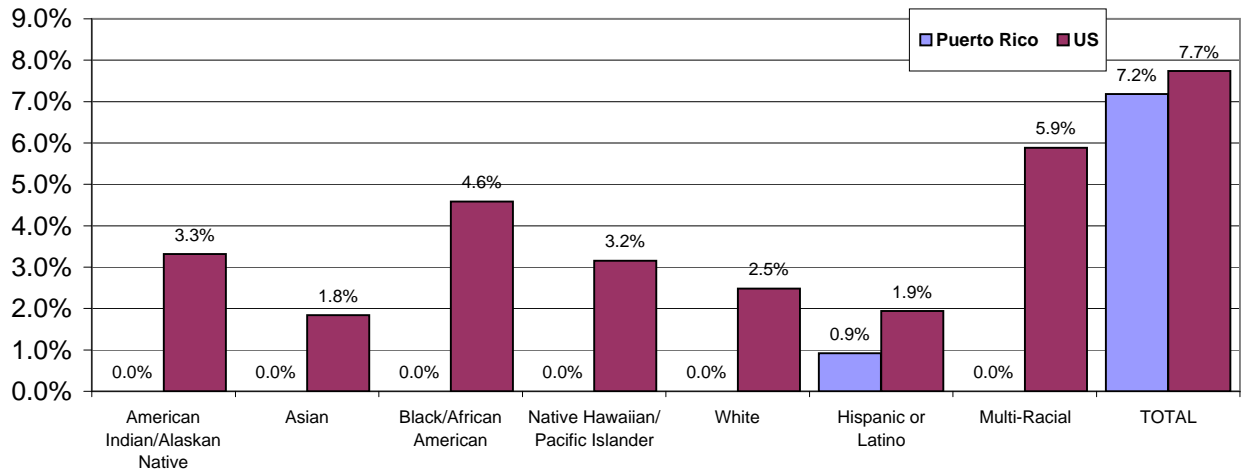
**Percent of Persons Served in MH Programs, who were Homeless, By Age: Year 7**

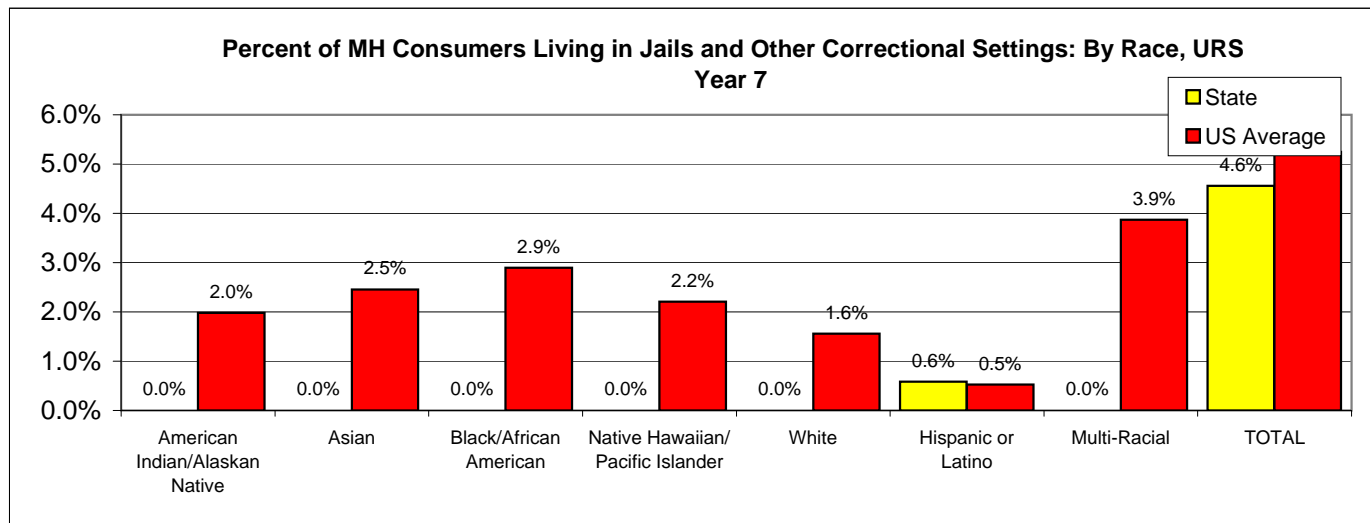

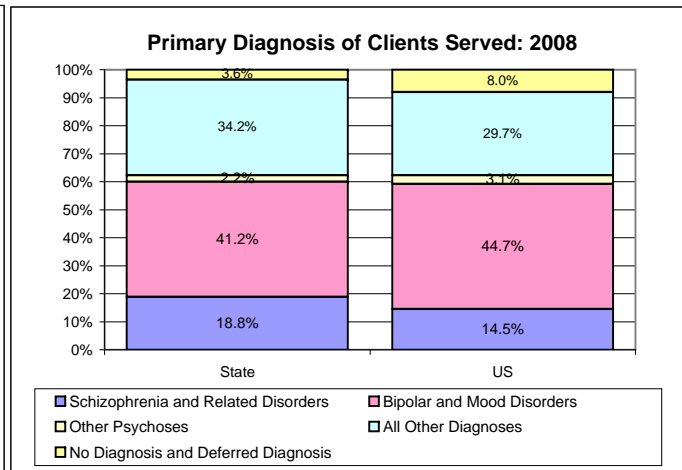

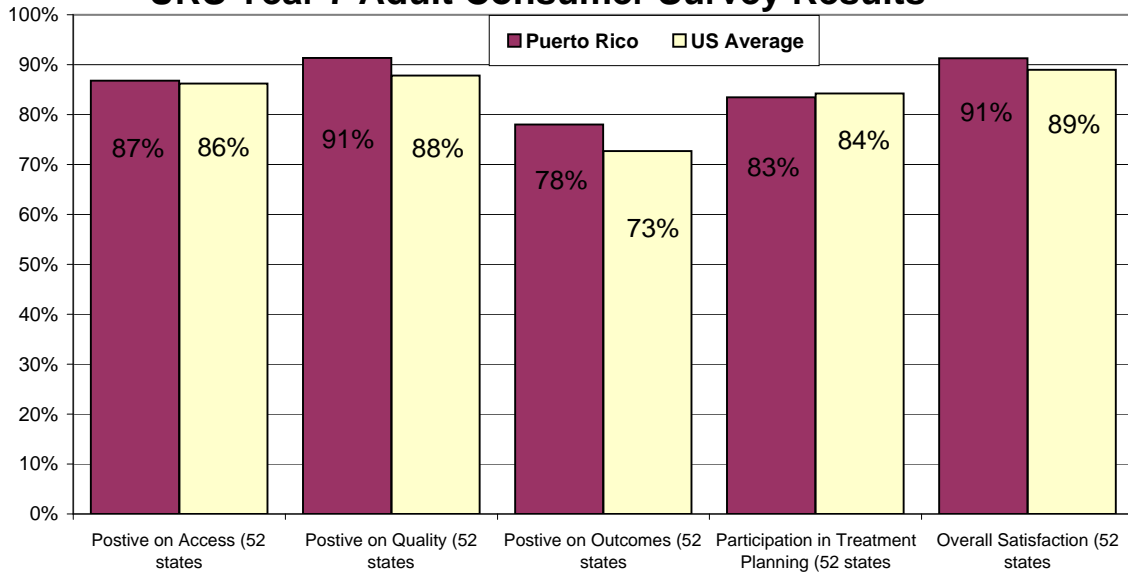

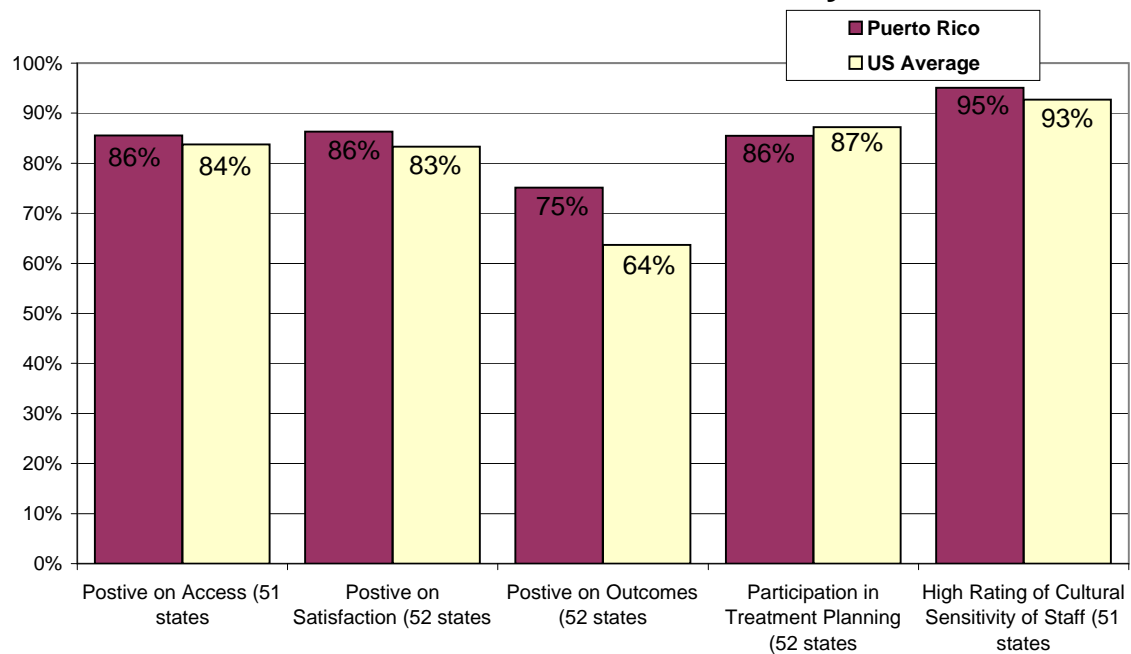
