For State Fiscal Year 2018, the following state expenditures were not included: two of the state forensic state hospitals, the state primary prevention services, the state ambulatory services and non 24 hour care mental health services. Other than direct services state administrative activities (not at program or provider level) were not included in state fiscal year 2018. Due to these reasons 2019 expenditures includes more expenditures that for 2018.
7A	For 2018, total evidence based practices for ESMI expenditure were 10% of estimated expenses of the MHBG assigned in Federal Fiscal Year. For 2019, EBP expenditure were based in SFY of the MHBG expenditure, comprising the period beginning on July 1, 2018 closing on June 30, 2019. MHBG 10% Set-Aside for ESMI of federal fiscal year 2019 was not fully expended in the closing period of PR State Fiscal year from July 2018 to June 2019.
8	For 2018, the expenditures were estimated expenses of the MHBG assigned in Federal Fiscal Year. For 2019, expenditure were based in SFY of the MHBG expenditure, comprising the period beginning on July 1, 2018 and ending on June 30, 2019. Expenditures were reported for State Fiscal Year (SFY) 7/1/2018-6/30/2019. In 2018 the expenditures were overestimated from MHBG federal fiscal year assigned. Total MHBG for Non-Direct Services Expenditure from state fiscal year 2017-2018 were estimated from MHBG federal fiscal year. 10	22% of the persons served were between 0-20 years old and 78% of the persons served were between 21-75+. Of all the clients attended in SFY 2019, 75% had SMI/SED, represented by 74% adults and 26% children, adolescents and young adults.
11	Adult Survey: the sample was smaller than last year, due to the transformation of recovery centers services to recovery oriented services in community was in the implementation phase. 33% less centers were surveyed. Still positive perception of outcomes is maintained, from a statistically representative sample of clients.
12	Compared to 2018, in SFY 2019, 43% more children/adolescents who meet the SED definition were served.

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12	In 2018-2019, 57% more children/adolescents with co-occurring MH/SA diagnosis were served in San Juan Municipality Mental Health Clinic, including those served by juvenile clients drug courts. Since first quarter of 2019, San Juan Municipal Children Ambulatory Mental Health Clinic is the only one operating mental health clinic for SED with PR State funds in the Metro Area. In addition to SED clients, the San Juan Municipal Clinic served clients from Juvenile Drug Courts in PR that had both substance use and mental health diagnosis. Another factor that increased the patients served was that in December of SFY 2018, the Bayamón Municipality mental health community center for Children/adolescents, located in Metro Area, closed. This last clinic also served children/adolescents who met the SED definition by PR State Funds. The clients of Bayamón community center were referred to San Juan Clinic.
14A	More client were served in community settings, see table 2A. The distribution of multiracial clients with SED/SMI represent 74% of PR general population. The reason for the high percent change from 2018 to 2019 is as follows: in 2018 the data analyzed with TEDS file extraction had issues in ethnic field definition. More than one race includes Puerto Rican, Mexican, Cuban, Dominican Republic and other races.
14B	Additional recovery oriented services were implemented in community and a recovery center was implemented in a General Psychiatric Hospital, during the year began recovery services in residential settings and recovery services for persons.
15A	56% more children/adolescents were served in community mental health setting compared to previous year, due to increase of recovery oriented services for first psychosis programs.
16	Supported housing services (SHS): For 2019, the Community Mental Health Recovery Services ubicated in Fajardo municipality that offered this SHS was closed. Clients from that municipality continued receiving other services in the a nearby municipality of Trujillo Alto.
16	Supported Employment: Peer support programs were implemented during 2019 in recovery oriented services centers.
16	Less children/adolescents were served during 2019. In December of SFY, one mental health community center for children/adolescents was closed in Bayamon municipality. Causing a decrease in a 13% of clients served, including ACT services. Other situation was that provider of the Mayaguez municipality not reported clients receiving ACT.
16	Data of community mental health services for children/adolescents clinic were added, increasing the number clients with SED served.
17	Family Psychoeducation: For 2019, the Community Mental Health Recovery Services ubicated in Fajardo was closed. The Recovery Oriented Services reorganized their recovery model for the best access to the clients. Clients from that Fajardo continued receiving other services in the a nearby municipality of Trujillo Alto.
17	Integrated Treatment for Co-occurring Disorders: For 2019 of this report the Community Mental Health Recovery Services ubicated in Fajardo was closed. The Recovery Oriented Services reorganized their recovery model for the best access to the clients. Clients from that Fajardo continued receiving other services in the a nearby municipality of Trujillo Alto.
17	Illness Self Management and Recovery: For 2019 the Community Mental Health Recovery Services transformed the model to Recovery Oriented Services, increasing clients served, see table 2A explanation. The ROS reorganized for clients better access.
17	Medication Management: For 2019, the Community Mental Health Recovery Services ubicated in Fajardo were closed. The Recovery Oriented Services reorganized their recovery model for the best access to the clients. Clients from that Fajardo continued receiving other services in the a nearby municipality of Trujillo Alto.
20B	In 2019, 25% more clients were discharged compared to 2018. Recovery in-house services were added at the General Psychiatric Hospital Unit opened in San Juan for clients near to their discharge date. Clients are referred to less restrictive community settings to continuum of recovery oriented services.
