

- Question: Will the outreach efforts be focused only on construction and infrastructure careers?
 Answer: No. The program will focus on several careers needed to advance broadband in Puerto Rico. While construction is one of them, there are several other careers needed, such as broadband technicians, customer service representatives, telecommunications engineers, and others. For more details check the notice of funding availability (NOFA) document.
- 2. **Question:** Am I supposed to send an application to offer broadband educational programs or to do the outreach/marketing for existing organizations?

Answer: The Community Recruiting Partners NOFA is to do the outreach/marketing. With this NOFA, we are focused on finding organizations that can help spread the word and help a) market existing broadband educational opportunities and b) disseminate job opportunities and career information on broadband. - 3. **Question:** Are there guidelines and templates for the dissemination of these programs? **Answer:** Yes. Puerto Rico Broadband Project will share marketing materials with selected grantees to ensure consistency and quality of the communications efforts.
- 4. **Question:** Can the promotion efforts include the services offered by the proposer, or should they only focus on services related to broadband careers?

Answer: The promotion/communications efforts must be related to broadband careers.
