EXECUTIVE ORDER OF THE GOVERNOR OF PUERTO RICO, HON. WANDA VÁZQUEZ-GARCED, DECLARING A STATE OF EMERGENCY AS A RESULT OF THE IMMINENT PASSAGE OF THE POTENTIAL TROPICAL "CYCLONE" ATMOSPHERIC PHENOMENON #9" AND/OR INVEST 92 L.

WHEREAS: The Government of Puerto Rico has the responsibility to carry out

all necessary measures to safeguard the health, life, property and

safety of residents and the Government.

WHEREAS: On July 28, 2020, the National Meteorological Service indicated that

there is a great possibility that, during the next 24 hours, Puerto Rico will receive the effects of winds, rain and potential flooding as a consequence of the passage of the atmospheric phenomenon. In view of this, a tropical storm warning is in effect over Puerto Rico.

WHEREAS: The passage of this atmospheric phenomenon threatens to cause

damage and has created an emergency situation that threatens public safety, basic services to the citizenship, economic activity

and social welfare of Puerto Rico.

WHEREAS: Article 6.10 of Act No. 20-2017, as amended, better known as

"Department of Safety and Security Act Public of Puerto Rico", empowers the Governor to decree a state of emergency on the Island and "give effect to those state regulations, orders, plans or measures for emergency or disaster situations or vary the same at her discretion", as well as "to dictate, amend and revoke those regulations and to issue, amend and rescind those orders that she deems appropriate to govern during the state of emergency or

disaster."

THEREFORE: I, WANDA VÁZQUEZ GARCED, Governor of Puerto Rico, by virtue

of the powers inherent in my office and the authority conferred on me by the Constitution and laws of Puerto Rico, hereby DECREE

and ORDER the following:



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SECTION 1: A state of emergency has been declared throughout Puerto Rico as

a result of the imminent passage of the Invest-92-L atmospheric

phenomenon and the impact it may cause.

SECTION 2: This declaration of emergency meets the requirements for all

agencies and municipalities to activate special emergency procurement procedures to acquire materials and services that are essential to respond to the emergency. This declaration of

emergency is separate from the declaration of emergency issued to

address the COVID-19 pandemic.

SECTION 3: The Department of Public Safety (DPS) will prepare and submit to

the Governor, the Director of the Office of Management and Budget and the Secretary of the Treasury an estimate of the funds required

to carry out the evacuation, rescue, response and recovery efforts

in the affected regions.

SECTION 4: Based on the estimate submitted by the DPS and the Assistant

General of Puerto Rico, the Secretary of the Department of the Treasury and the Director of the Office of Management and Budget will assign to the Secretary of the DPS and other agencies involved (as identified by the Secretary of the Department of the Treasury and the Director of the Office of Management and Budget) the funds available to comply with the provisions of this Executive Order. The Secretary of the Treasury and the Director of the Office of Management and Budget are authorized to establish, from any available funds, including the Emergency Fund, a special budget to cover those expenses necessary to carry out the eviction, rescue,

Order.

SECTION 5: The DPS and other agencies involved shall provide the Secretary

of the Department of Finance and the Director of the Office of Management and Budget with a detailed report on the expenses incurred at the close of the work carried out pursuant to this

response and recovery efforts in accordance with this Executive

Executive Order.

SECTION 6: DEFINITION OF AGENCY. For purposes of this Executive Order,

the term "Agency" refers to any agency, instrumentality, office or dependency of the Executive Branch of the Government of Puerto

Rico, including public corporations, regardless of its name.



SECTION 7: DEROGATION. This Executive Order supersedes any other

executive order that in whole or in part is incompatible with this one

to the extent that such incompatibility exists.

SECTION 8: <u>VALIDITY</u>. This Executive Order shall be effective immediately.

SECTION 9: SEVERABILITY. The provisions of this Executive Order are

separate and independent of each other, and if any part, section, provision, or sentence of this Executive Order is declared unconstitutional, void, or invalid by a court of jurisdiction and venue, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining

provisions, which shall remain in full force.

SECTION 10: NON CREATION OF ENFORCEABLE RIGHTS. This Executive

Order is not intended to create any rights, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law or equity, by any person or entity, in any matter, civil, criminal, or administrative, against the Government of Puerto

Rico or its agencies, officials, employees, or any other person.

SECTION 11: PUBLICATION. This Executive Order is to be filed immediately

with the Department of State and the widest possible publication

is hereby ordered.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I hereby issue this Executive Order under my signature and cause the Great Seal of the Government of Puerto Rico to be affixed in San Juan, Puerto Rico, on this **29**th day of July of 2020.
